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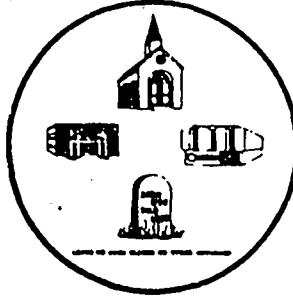

JOSEPH GREEN ESTATE - 1851

Joseph GREEN died in Guilford County, North Carolina in 1851 leaving neither wife nor children. He owned a tract of land "on the waters of Moon's Creek of Reedy Fork, adjoining the lands of Cyrus STANLEY, Cyrus BRITTON, and Jonathan GARDNER, about 95 acres." From the time of his death until 1855 his estate was not settled. All of his family had moved "west", and even up to the division of proceeds of the sale of the property, all were not located. The petition to the Guilford County Court of Equity was filed at the Spring Term 1855. The following letter written in 1853 illustrates the migration patterns of many families from this area.

State of Indiana Hamilton County
3rd Month the 11th 1853

Respected friend,

I may inform thee that I received thy letter in Due time informing me that it was nessary to send thee the names of all the heirs at law of Joseph GREEN, Deceased; and their place of residence which is as follows to wit:

John GREEN, Mahaska County, State of Ioway, the only Brother living also two sisters heirs at law of Joseph GREEN, Decd, as follows: Sarah FARMER, late Sarah GREEN living in Randolph County, Indiana, and Elizabeth BREWER, late Elizabeth GREEN, her place of residence not known By me I suppose somewhere in Indiana and the Sons and Daughters of Hannah KING, Decd., late Hannah GREEN. She first married John WILKERSON and had two Daughters, their names and place of residence unknown to me. The said John WILKERSON then Died and their Mother, the said Hannah, married Curtis KING had five children by him as follows: Martha, Mary, Meedy, John, and Curtis and then their mother died leaving them heirs at law of Joseph GREEN, Decd.

Martha lives in Ioway, her man's name unknown to me. Mary married James JONES lives somewhere in Indiana. Meedy lives in Indiana married her man's name unknown to me. John and Curtis living some place in Indiana.

Also the Sons and Daughters of Jacob GREEN heirs at law of Joseph GREEN, Decd. as Follows:

Rachel NEWBY, wife of Barnaby NEWBY, Mary HACKET, wife of Moses HACKET, Joseph Green, John GREEN, Seth GREEN all in Indiana all of the heirs of the said Joseph GREEN, Decd. that I have any knowldege or Ever had.

A HISTORY OF REHOBETH UNITED METHODIST CHURCH CEMETERY
AND A CENSUS OF THE OLDER PART

Rehobeth has one of the most unique cemeteries to be found, in that three races are buried in it--White, Black and Indian. The white burials are well known. The black burials are not known to the present generation, but has been known to past generations. The late J. Y. Short related to some of the present generation that he saw the last one buried. The black section is located in the southeast corner of the present cemetery. There is only marker there and the epitaph part of it is broken off and lost. The Indian burial part is unknown, but is believed to be beneath the south end of the education building part of the church. When the excavation was done there was some outlines of graves in the excavation walls. However, on searching the dirt and outline of graves, no bones or artifacts were found. The late Monroe Kirkman (1842-1939) told that his grandparents told him that Indians were buried on the property.

A diligent effort in much researching in trying to find out the beginning of the cemetery has found no documentation except the following.

In 1881 the preacher of that day, R. M. Hoyle, reported to a quarterly conference that year that the graveyard at Rehobeth was begun about 1800 and Morning Davis was the first person buried in it. That was all that was said. There are no facts as to his race or place of burial. There were probably many burials before the first marker was installed, as many rocks were removed in 1947 when the cemetery was plowed, leveled off and seeded. These rocks were mostly in the center on the east side of the present cemetery. The oldest marker found is that of Martha Parker buried in 1842. More will be said about this marker later on in this article.

The first part of the present cemetery was surrounded by a split rail fence until about 1865 or 75 when the cemetery was enlarged and a three strand twisted wire fence was installed on metal posts. This must have been a luxury for that day. The reason for fences in those days were there were no stock laws and cows and hogs were roaming the country side at will. About 1915 the above described fence had deteriorated to the point it needed replacing or done away with. There was much discussion about replacing it as a stock law had been passed. However, it was decided to replace it with a woven wire fence on wooden posts. This fence lasted until about 1930-35 when the fence was removed and has been open ever since. The cemetery at this time or a bit later was enlarged to its present size, with the exception of the first four rows on the west side, which were added in 1954. In 1973 and 1974 another addition was cleared and filled in on the north side.

Until 1947 the cemetery was a mess with briars, weeds and other wild vegetation prevailing. However, before this time, once a year it looked fair, as it was cleaned off just before "Big Meeting" time with voluntary help from members and sometimes with hired help toward the last. In 1947 the Minor brothers were hired to grade and prepare it for seeding. This was some of the best spent money Rehobeth ever spent, as today it will compare with any beautiful cemetery.

This cemetery is not composed of people of the great and near great as the world rates people in the business, political, and other forms of life. They are the great and near great of the Kingdom of God who have helped to make Rehobeth and its members along with others what it is and they are today. God Bless!

DEPARTED THIS LIFE
 MARTHA PARKER
 WIFE OF JONATHAN PARKER
 ON THE 22 OF 7 MO 1842
 AGED 70 YEARS 9 MONTHS 25 DAYS
 BORN
 27 OF 9 MO 1771
 SHE LIVED A MARRIED WOMAN
 54 YEARS & 7 MONTHS
 WAS THE MOTHER OF 8 CHILDREN
 SHE LEFT BEHIND
 MANY OTHER FEMALE EQUALS
 BUT NONE
 TO EXCEL HER IN TENDER FEELINGS
 AND FEMALE RECTITUDE

Rest from thy labours reliever of distress
 Who spent thy life on serving thy sex
 Dear females as you pass look on with grief
 For the loss of one so ready to relieve
 Through storms of every kind and piercing cold
 Thy life from danger thou did'st ne'er withhold

Jonathan Parker was a state representative in Raleigh 4 yrs. and state senator 12 yrs. in the early 19th century.

The Weatherlys of Guilford County, North Carolina

The account which follows is based on the research efforts of eight Weatherly descendants. Several of these people are identified in the text as having special knowledge of a particular branch. In addition, information on allied families was provided by Ruth F. Thompson, Greensboro, NC, Francine and Cletus Swaim, Liberty, NC, and Elsie Menzel, Durant, OK.

The first Weatherlys appear in Guilford County records in the late 1770s. There are several family traditions of earlier residence in Maryland. One family specifies the Eastern Shore area. Our initial inquiry was directed to Somerset County, Md, where one Weatherly family migrated from Virginia in 1671. No tie was found between this Somerset County family and those Weatherlys of Dorchester/Caroline County, MD, who did move to Guilford; nor has any positive evidence appeared to show relationships among the Caroline County Weatherlys, other than that they were closely associated. A 1778 census in Great Choptank Hundred, Caroline County, lists Abner Weatherly, Edward Weatherly, Isaiah Weatherly, Isaac Weatherly, Jesse Weatherly, John Weatherly and William Weatherly as males 18 or older on 28 February 1778. All but Jesse and Isaac were landowners. Of the landowners, Isaiah definitely moved to Guilford; Abner and Edward are identified by strong circumstantial evidence; William by association and timing. A Jesse and an Isaac appear in Guilford, associated with the others.

In the following paragraphs, the Guilford Weatherlys will be discussed in the order of their arrival in the county. Before doing so, John Weatherly of Caroline must be explained. He first appeared in the records of Dorchester (later Caroline) County in 1740. He purchased a land grant that year, which he named "Weatherlys Chance". He also testified in a "boundary perpetuation" hearing which places him in Dorchester County in 1738, living on Three Hickory Branch. Near him was Anthony Chilcutt, Sr., whose grandson, John Chilcutt, moved to Guilford County in or before 1780. The last reference to John Weatherly is in October 1786, when he sold his land. John would have been at least 67 years old at this time. The date of his sale is near the dates of sales by Abner and Isaiah, who reappear shortly afterward in Guilford.

Throughout the following discussion, any public records and any geographic locations not otherwise identified are in Guilford County.

From land records, Edward Weatherly (born in or before 1748) was the first to move to Guilford. He appeared initially in Dorchester County in 1769, when he made his first land purchase near Anthony Chilcutt, Sr. Edward made several purchases and sales of land, including a small tract bought from Abner Weatherly. In October 1777, Edward and his wife, Henrietta, sold their Caroline land, remaining there until at least February 1778. In December 1778, Edward Weatherly, wife Henrietta, made his first land purchase in Guilford, on the Reedy Fork Branch, near Rockingham County. Edward died in 1810; Henrietta about 1822.

Estate records for Edward and his son Edward are somewhat confusing, since both were referred to as "Edward, Sr.". These records can be clarified with the aid of an oral account of Ross Dewitt Weatherly, grandson of the second Edward. A partial list of the elder Edward's children also appears in Rev. S.M. Rankin's History of Buffalo Presbyterian Church. A composite list of children is:

Jesse Weatherly appeared next in central Guilford, where he purchased land on Buffalo Creek in October 1779. The 1790 census shows 4 males over 16, 2 under 16, 5 females. Later census returns are contradictory, suggesting the possibility of a younger Jesse. Two sons, James and Andrew, are identified by deeds of gift. Land and marriage bond records suggest that Curtis and Zebedee Weatherly were also Jesse's sons. Incomplete estate and guardian files show that a Jesse was guardian of a Wright Weatherly; that James, wife Mary, died in 1816; that Andrew died about 1819. Curtis and Zebedee left Guilford County, eventually reaching Washington County, VA.

More data are available on the descendants of James Weatherly, but are incomplete and require discussion beyond the scope of this article. In addition, Rankin, previously identified, gives a partial discussion of this family.

NOTE: Some records on this family are maintained by Waverly Barbe, 13 Audubon Place, Tuscaloosa, AL 35401.

William Weatherly appeared in central Guilford in May 1782, when he bought land near Jesse. Job Weatherly, barely 21, witnessed this transaction. Later in the same neighborhood were Isaac, Isaiah, Joseph, Jeremiah and Levi. Earlier, in May 1769, a William Weatherly bought a land grant in Dorchester County, MD, which he named "Weatherlys Venture". Later, he bought 40 acres of Abner Weatherly's "Nancys Delight". In September 1780, William, then in Sussex County, Delaware, sold his Maryland land to Isaiah Weatherly. No tax, estate or census records have been found for him in Sussex County.

After living among the "South Buffalo" Weatherlys for 16 years, in 1798 William sold his land and moved to the Reedy Fork area near Abner and Edward. Levi and Joseph Weatherly followed him to this area. This William does not appear in the 1790 Guilford Census, nor do any other South Buffalo Weatherlys, except Job and Jesse. Rankin, previously cited, states that William was the father of "Abner, Joseph and others" but goes on to confuse William, Abner and Abner's son William. "Old" William died in 1805; his wife Elizabeth in 1807-8. His will (Book A, page 411, dated 16 Sep 1805, proved Nov 1805) identifies only Elizabeth, son and executor Levi, "daughter" Mary and Mary's son, Noah Weatherly. However, land records suggest prolonged association between William and Job and among Job, Levi, Joseph and Jeremiah. Each of these men is discussed in following paragraphs. William's grandson Noah is not accounted for, however a Noah Weatherly does appear later (1830) in Hickman County, TN. This man was approximately the same age as William's grandson.

Job Weatherly first purchased land in 1797, although he was in Guilford in May 1782. Job bought and sold several tracts of land and several land warrants, making his last known sale in October 1811. Some time later, he moved to Lauderdale County, Alabama. Job left a family Bible which survives. It shows a total of 16 children:

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As there were two daughters named Mary Ann, it is suggested that the first died. The Bible shows no marriages and no deaths, except Job, who died "the third day of August 1833 in his seventy first or seventy second year". William M. married Tabetha Fields, bond date 16 Aug 1810. They went with Job to Alabama and later

removed to Yalobusha County, Mississippi, where William died in 1836, leaving 1 daughter, 3 sons. Sarah may have married Moses Swalm (possibly Moses, son of William Swalm and Charity Vickrey) and have died young. Job Parker and John Alexander eventually reached Texas. Samuel is tentatively identified as living in Maury County, TN in 1850. Marriage records of Lauderdale County, AL, list Annie/Amy Weatherly, Elizabeth Weatherly, Tamsey (Fannie?) Weatherly and Phebe Weatherly. The latter three are at a time consistent with the ages of Job's daughters of the same names. Lauderdale records also reflect a Jeremiah Weatherly married a Marla Farris on 12 August 1830. This is probably William M.'s eldest son, Jeremiah F.

NOTE: Mrs. Hollis Weatherly, Route 5 Box 172B, Nacadoches, TX 75961 has records of this family.

Levi Weatherly, William's known son, was born ca 1765-70. He married first Sarah Coe (daughter of John and Sarah Coe), bond date 9 Aug 1793. In July 1796, he first bought land. Sometime later he purchased a state grant which he assigned to Joseph Weatherly. Sarah died after one or more children were born and Levi married a Celia Ozmond, bond date 27 Nov 1799. In July of that year he sold his land on the South Buffalo, apparently to follow his father to the Reedy Fork area. He later appears transferring land in Rockingham County, probably as William's executor. He is listed in the 1800 census for Rockingham County. A Levi is listed for some years in the Wilson County, TN census and is believed to be this man. The last entry is in 1840, age 70-80. At the same time, other younger Weatherlys are listed in this area.

Joseph Weatherly first appeared in 1799, when he recorded the 18 acre grant assigned to him by Levi. In 1800, he married Mary Fulton (daughter of Samuel and Jane Fulton). In 1803, Joseph purchased land from Samuel Fulton, selling it in 1805. In or before 1811, he moved to White County, TN. On 13 November 1814, Joseph was drafted from the militia for wartime service and was killed in a skirmish near New Orleans on 28 December 1814. Mary settled his estate in 1816 and returned to North Carolina. On 10 May 1820, Samuel Fulton transferred land "where I now live" to his daughter Mary Weatherly and her children. In 1852 and 1853, Mary was in McMinn County, TN, where she made application for a widow's pension and for land grants. There are conflicting dates in these papers, probably due to lapse of time and poor health. She shows her age as both 70 and 77 and lists the following children:

Jeremiah Weatherly first appears in a marriage bond dated 12 August 1786 with Margaret Alexander. His sole known land purchase is dated 1805, however an 1802 sale by Peter Fields places him on the tract in 1802. Also, his bondsman for marriage was David Kerr, a resident of the same area. Jeremiah sold his land in December 1812. He is not identifiable in the 1790-1810 Guilford census; however a "J" Weatherly does appear in his neighborhood in 1810. "J" is shown as having 1 male over 45, 1 male 16-26, 1 male under 10, 1 female 26-45, 1 female 16-26, 3 females 10-16, 2 females under 10. The 1820 census for Bedford County, TN shows

a Jeremiah Weatherly over 45 and a John Wetherly 26-45, both with families. Bedford County land records are incomplete and show only one transaction by an Abner Weatherly in 1836. Abner appears in the 1830 census for Bedford and in the 1840 and 1850 census for Marshall County (formed in part from Bedford). Abner was born ca 1808 in North Carolina. The 1850 Marshall census also shows a Joseph Weatherly born ca 1820 in Tennessee. Marshall land records show nothing pertinent.

Circumstances suggest that Jeremiah and Margaret were the parents of Mary "Polly" Weatherly, b ca 1790 d ca 1855, Prairie County, AR, married ca 1809 William Jeremlah Swaim b ca 1782 d Nov 1851, Prairie County (son of William Swaim and Charity Vickrey). Mary had 13 children who left descendants in Illinois, Tennessee, Arkansas and Texas.

NOTE: Mrs O.H. Herrington Jr, 600 Dennis Drive, De Soto, TX 75115 has extensive records on descendants of Mary Weatherly Swaim.

Having described the younger Weatherlys grouped around William, we return to the older generation. Isaac Weatherly followed William in order of land purchase. Isaac presents a special problem. Two separate Isaacs have been identified in the Guilford area. One appeared while Isaac of Caroline County was still in Maryland. This earlier Isaac served throughout the Revolution as a private. In 1783, he received a payment in cash. In 1785, his heirs received a land grant for 640 acres in Davidson County, TN. The original grant lacks any endorsement of transfer and was taken up by George Augustus Suggs, a land speculator. There is an oral tradition among Isaiah Weatherly's descendants (see later discussion of Isaiah) that this first Isaac was Isaiah's father. Nothing has been found to prove or refute this. The sole land record in Guilford for the second Isaac was a purchase on 13 Sep 1783, near William Weatherly. In 1787, Isaac and his wife, Rody, sold this land, in part to Isaiah Weatherly.

Isaiah Weatherly, b ca 1750, was in Guilford County in September 1786, according to a Caroline County land transfer. A 1787 Caroline transfer places him in Rockingham County (perhaps near Edward Weatherly). Over a period of several months (May-October 1787) Isaiah sold off his Caroline County holdings and began to buy land in central Guilford, continuing until shortly before his death in 1817. His Maryland transactions began in 1775 with the purchase of a small grant. In 1780, he bought William's "Weatherlys Venture". The 1783 Caroline County Tax Assessment shows his household as 3 males, 5 females, 1 slave child. His wife in 1787 was a Mary. At the time of his death, his wife was a Nancy, who later married the Rev. Christopher Vickrey. Isaiah left many records in Guilford County. Also, his son William M. died without issue, resulting in extended probate records, identifying the children of William's sisters. From all sources the following children of Isaiah appear:

Isaiah m (1) (probably) Martha Prichard (2) Jane McGibbony. Isaiah left no issue; Jane survived him. He appears in the 1812 Militia list- Capt William Doak's 4th Cavalry Company.

Isaac b 4 Mar 1791 d 20 Mar 1858 m Hulda Coe b 26 Mar 1786 d 6 Oct 1853 (daughter of John and Sarah Coe). Isaac served in the 4th Cavalry Company with Isaiah. See above.

Henry b ca 1792 m Delitha King (daughter of Henry King), Rockingham County bond date 30 Aug 1821. He appears in the 1812 Muster.

Abner b ca 1802 m Judith King (daughter of Henry King), Rockingham County bond date 1 Jul 1827. Abner and Henry removed to McNairy County, TN.

There are land records in Rockingham County for these two, not reviewed.

William M. b ca 1800, possibly married, died without issue

Ann/Annie/Any m (1) _____ Jones (2) James Millis

The probate of William M. Weatherly's estate was extended over a long period and contains the names of many relatives. An interested reader should examine the files.

NOTE: Miss Sophie Tilden, 607 W. Main Street, Jamestown, NC 27282 has extensive records on the Isaiah Weatherly and John Coe families.

Abner Weatherly, wife Margaret, appeared in northern Guilford in August 1788, near Edward. Abner originally purchased land in Dorchester County, MD in December 1766. After several transactions, including sales to William and Edward, he owned "Lamphigh" and part of "Nancys Delight". He is listed in the Caroline County Tax Assessment of 1783 with 5 males, 3 females. In August 1786, Abner Weatherly, wife Margaret, sold his land in Caroline County. The 1790 Guilford census shows Abner with 3 males over 16, 1 female. Near him is a William Weatherly, 1 male over 16, 1 female. This is undoubtedly his son who married Jane (Jean) Fulton (daughter of Samuel and Jane Fulton), bond date 30 May 1790.

Abner retired in February 1813, turning his remaining property over to his son Andrew, to care for Abner and Margaret. In the prior year, he transferred land to his sons. Abner's family can be rather fully identified through deeds of gift, marriage records, census returns and the will of Andrew, who died without issue. There were 4 sons and 1 daughter who reached maturity.

Abner b ca 1770 m Polly (possibly Doak) Work, widow of John Work.
 Abner was the Sheriff of Guilford County for some period. He removed to Rutherford County, TN about 1808 and remained there. The census shows that there were several children. There are a number of colorful tales about an Abner Weatherly, some of which relate to this Abner. Others may refer to Abner F.

Andrew b ca 1771 d 1852 was probably married at least twice. He had no surviving children. Marriage bond dated 5 Mar 1833 shows his marriage to Elizabeth Fleming, a widow, sister of John Starrett.

Peter b in or before 1777, wife unknown.

Unnamed children are mentioned in Andrew's will. A Peter Wetherby is listed in the 1812 Militia List, detached to 6th Regiment, Captain Mears' Company, under the 1812 call for troops.

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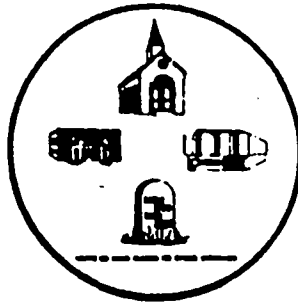
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TWO VICKREY BROTHERS GO WEST

Copy of an old letter written by William Madison Vickrey (son of Abiathar Vickrey and his first wife, Elizabeth Swaim) to his family in Jamestown, Guilford County, N. C., after he drove a wagon train from Jamestown to Pettis County, Missouri, for Enoch Stephens and wife, Betsy Armfield (dau. of Joseph C. Armfield & Elizabeth Beeson).

Pettis County, Mo.
August 1st / 59

Dear relations

I seat miself this morning to write afew lines in answer to the except-able letter which I received the 30th which was a great satisfaction to hear that you were all well but sorrow to here that little Mary was troubled with boils but I hope they are better by this time.

We had a considerable chance of rain on us the first week that we were on the road but after that we had but one rain on us untill we landed. We commenced Assending the blue ridge on friday evening 20th May and camped within about 3 miles of fancy gap. the wind blew so hard that night that It turned every tent over that was on the hill. I was in a wagon some 50 yards from the tents and I thought it would roll down the bend of the road and if it had it would have gone down about a quarter for the roads in the mountains are wound around and dug in the side of them. there is a precipice above on one side and below on the other which looks dangerous. we had some very hilly Country to travel through untill we crossed newridge then for awhile there was some fine country untill we began to come to the hills near the Cumberland Mountain where the country began to become poor and broken and remained so for somthing over 100 miles. We were assending the Cumberland mountain June the 3rd the day you had a storm we had no rain on us that day it was very warm untill in the evening when it turned cool enough for the women to draw on their shawls. we camped on the top of the mountain. We drove on and crossed the cumberland river in the evening there was alittle frost there and when we got two or three days drive the corn was bitten considerably and nomore appearance of it from that on. From Mt. Vernon in Ky. to Louisville there is some of as fine country as ever I beheld but it could not be purchased by a poor man as it will in places bring \$100.00 per acre but when we crossed the Ohio river into the Indiana it was hilly and poor for some time but toward Vincennes there was some very good country. We had to lay by 20th and 21st June within some 7 miles of Vincennes resting a lame horse and their wheat harvest was just coming on. Our camp was at a Widow Langtons there was some of the hoops¹ about there to count. I coped wood there the last half day that we stayed there, and

the old lady wanted me to stay and help her through with her harvest and then just to work on the plantation. I could have made \$1.50 per day through harvest and about \$18.00 per month after that.

When we left there we came into Illinois there was some tolerably good country for a short distance then it was quite moderate for some time but [in] the western part of the state there is some very fine prairie land if it was a little more rolling but there was some of as great wheat as ever I have seen in any of the old Carolina bottoms. they do not attempt to cut it with the cradle but they take the four horse reaper and they can give six or eight binders enough.

But when we crossed the Mississippi river we came into the rough rocky hilly country and not very rich until we got up into Pettis [County] the land began to get better and not so many rocks against we reached the northwest corner of the County we found the land tolerably rich. We are in the northwest corner of the County in the midst of the fertile prairies where the grass grows better in the range with great herds of cattle and horses on it than it does in the best of the Carolina meadows in the low lands the grass grows about as high as my head and as thick as it can stand but the stock does not go there much on account of the flies. upon the high ground the grass grows about knee high except where it is burnt in the spring and there it is tender and is kept picked off. their corn looks very well they run their rows about three feet apart and have four and five stalks in a hill and one and two good ears to the stalk wheat made a failure this year or nearly so on account of a backward spring and the rust Oats light. There is one great objection that I have to this country and that is timber is so scarce they have no barns through here and many of them have no stables that 15 or 20 horses, and two or three times that number of cattle.

We landed at Calvin Dillons the 13th of July and stayed there two or three days then went to Mrs. Sarah Chipman's and stayed there about a week until they could get a house to go into. then we moved out to it. Calvin Dillon took his parents into the house with him and Albert and Mr. Stevens went in [a] house together. I still make my home with them for Mrs. Stephens seems so much like a Mother to me, but I am at work for a man by the name of Wyllis Winston doing plantation work at \$15.00 per month but I cannot tell how long I may work for him but not long if I can get a school. School teachers can get from \$30 to \$50 per month. I must draw my scrap to a close as I am going to the election at Brownsville in Saline. this leaves us all well except cold and I hope it will find you all well. I did not get my likeness taken at Salem as they did not want to stop and I had to go on. I saw Lucinda Daniels and Smith Davis yesterday they were well.

Please excuse all the mistakes and bad writing as it had to be done in great haste give my love to all relations and inquiring friends. I want you all to write soon and give all the news, and Direct to Dunksburg Pettis Co Mo. I remain your affection Brother and Son

Copy of an old letter written by Elkanah Swaim Vickrey (son of Abiathar Vickrey and his first wife, Elizabeth Swaim) to his family in Jamestown, Guilford County, N. C., after he and his sister, Frances (called Fanny) Vickrey arrived in Indiana from Guilford County.

Jethrew Swaims
near Burlington
March 26, 1866

Dear Father and Mother
Brothers and sisters

I take my pen in hand to inform you that I am well and that we arrived safely here. I have been well ever since I left home and have enjoyed my self very well; But as to Sister she has been complaining more or less ever since we started; but I suppose that the water does not agree with her is the reason. Well, I will give you some account of our journey out here we left Greensboro on the night of the 19th at 10 oclock. Arrived at Raleigh 4 oclock on the morning of the 20th change cars here for Weldon. Fare From Greensboro to Raleigh \$2.40 leave Raleigh at five oclock on the way for Weldon; It commenced to rain about six oclock and rained all day but we have a very good house, but still it run through occasionally. Distance from R. to W. 100 miles Fare 2.00 dollars arrived at Weldon at 4 oclock A.M. then we had to walk down to the river (Neuse) which was a very muddy walk and then crossed the river in flat boats; the river is about 800 yds wide; the railroad bridge at this place will soon be finished so the train can cross. We change cars at this place for Portsmouth which is 80 miles. Fare \$4.00. arrive at this place at five in the evening. Then go on board the Steamer Georgana (which is one of the greatest houses that I ever saw it being about one hundred yds long, and 50 broad)

Leave for Baltimore at six in the Evening which is a distance of 200 miles. fare \$2.00. We were on board of this vessal only a few hours when she grounded on a sand bar in sight of Fortress Monroe. Well I can only tell you that being on the water out of sight of land is one of the most grand sights that ever I saw. We all went to bed and took a good nights rest, (as they have beds on board for all that wish to sleep).

We arrived at 8:15 on the morn of the 21st and found that we were not in time for the train, so we had to lay over till ten oclock at night; which gave me a chance to look about the town. I went and saw Washingtons monument in this city which is a sight; it being built of granite, and ascended by 228 steps after we leave the main house, we went up in a circle around, and around in the inside which was very tiresome; but we could see all the city of Baltimore and the country for miles around; and also Hundreds of sail ships and Steams lying off on the Bay, (The Chesapeake). Well we left here at ten and passed Harpers ferry in the morning at 2 oclock. we saw plenty of snow on the mountains at day break this morning the 22nd. And the next great sight was going through tunnels in the mountains; we passed through eight or ten of them we were detained by a slide in one of the tunnels about one hour; Then we arrived at the Ohio [River] 5 oclock in the eve. crossed the river on a steamboat and found the cars gone. so we had to lay over till five in the morn of the 23rd. About this time we pay Coffin our far which was \$2.00. Distance from Balt. to Indianapolis 675 miles fare \$8.00. We passed by Columbus and Zanesville and several other places on.

the road which I cannot mention. Arrived at Knightston half past 8 in the evening of 23rd (Friday).

Got out to Cousin Lewis's [Phillips] the next morn via Carthage and Burlington walk from Burlington to Cousins, and found them well as I promised to tell you where Mr. Mills stopped, I will just say that he went on to Indianapolis and farther I suppose.

I must tell you who came out with us Jonathan Hogin and his six children, W. L. Wright, Tery Merris, David Wilson and J. Swindle and wife (newly married) and W. A. Burgess from Cedar falls Ira Woll and family Eli Marley and sister (Fannie Ledbetter) who is going to catch David Osborn. Well I believe that is about all from our county but there was about 75 in all.

I must close by describing the place that where I am writing is at Obed Swaims. Jethrew is lying on the bed before me he looks very bad. Susan is setting by the fire piecing a quilt she is a very smart old lady yet she is 79 years, he is 83 on the 9th of Sept. Well it is the intention to go on to Hendrix [County] in a few days, but I do not [know] when. Jethrew and Susan says to rememberer love to Father and Mother and also to grandmother. Aunt Susan say that they are getting along as well as common. Jethrero does not sufer much pain, but he is very weak he has been confined to his bed about two months; but hopes that when warm weather comes he will be able to be about again. The connections are generly well. Thomas Northam and family are well and Yancy Swaim's is well.

I have been home with Cousin Richard [Phillips] he lives at Jethrew Bornard or (Bornett) they are amongst the cleverest people that I ever saw. Richard and myself went to Church last night and I saw and got acquainted with many of the north Carolina people as this part of the country are chiefly from N. C. Barnards wife was a Gardner and raised at the old Howren place Richard and Lewis said to tell his folks that he and family are well.

I am going to John Leonards to night he lives about 3 miles from here. There is some Mud in this state if you dont care, but it is froze almost hard enough to bear up on the brances.

As it is very near night I must close by asking you to excuse bad writing and etc. From your loving, 'E'

Write as soon as you get this and direct your letter to Planefield Hendrix [County] as we expect to stay there. E. S. Vickrey

Be sure and write as soon as you get this Excuse this bad letter as I was in a hurry and not hardly time to write for talking.

TROTTER HISTORY
by
Mrs. Philip N. Peacock

About ten years ago the late Mrs. Mary (Peacock) Douglas sent this writer part of a letter she had inherited from her mother Mary E. (Trotter) Peacock. The letter is written by her mother's brother, William L. Trotter, to a Miss Ellen S. Hildreth, Decatur, Alabama, and quite possibly is a draft of a later letter to Miss Hildreth. The body of the letter contained some information on Josiah Trotter. On separate sheets of paper he had listed the names of Josiah Trotter's children but they were not in proper order. Over a period of perhaps six years the writer's husband, Philip N. Peacock, very diligently search this line, and gradually put each child in proper order of their birth.

The body of the letter is as follows and on the proceeding pages will be found information on the children of Josiah Trotter.

Miss Ellen S. Hildreth
Decatur, Alabama

Greensboro, N. C. April 25, 1904

Dear Madam,

Your letter of 18th addressed to Mary E. Trotter, Greensboro, N. C. has been handed to me for reply. And I take pleasure in giving you the limited information in my possession concerning our family.

Unfortunately, I haven't in my possession anything definite as regard to dates and will approximate as near as I can.

Josiah Trotter came from England to America and took up a grant of land in Guilford County, N. C. about the year 1750.* This land was distant from old Martinsville which was the scene of the historic Battle of Guilford Courthouse about 5 or 6 miles. Josiah Trotter was a Revolutionary War Soldier and family tradition says he was a man of great physical strength and courage. It is said that David Fanning and his party of Tories, who terrorized the country for many miles around, once paid Josiah Trotter a call on one of their expeditions and he put the whole gang to flight.

He was very fond of deer hunting and there was a large post oak tree, near a stream on his place, where he concealed himself among the leafy branches and shot the deer when they came to the stream to drink. His last request was that they bury him beneath this tree. I do not know when he died but it was after the Revolutionary War. My father knew where the grave was and in his boyhood the tree was still standing. (Note: The letter ended here and on the next pages were the children of Josiah Trotter).

*Note: The Land Grant was not in Guilford County, N. C. That county not formed until 1771. It could have been in the vicinity of Orange County, N. C. but the writer believes there is some confusion about that and more proof before that can be accepted.

Josiah Trotter - born ca. 1730 in England and lived and died in Guilford County, N. C. The exact date of his death is not known. His will was drawn up on February 25, 1792 and probated May 1792. His place of burial was probably on his plantation under the tree, mentioned in the letter, where he hunted deer. His wife's name was Jane, last name unknown. It is not known when she was born, who her parents were, or when she died. Children of this union were:

The following is all the information that has been obtained on the above children.

- # 1. Hannah Trotter - no information, except she may have married a Cranner.
- # 2. Joseph Trotter - lived and died in Guilford County, N. C. Exact date of his death not known but believed to be shortly before 1826. His wife was Ruth Anthony whom he married on January 10, 1800 in Guilford County, N. C. She was the daughter of James & Lydia (Coffin) Anthony. After Joseph died Ruth took two of her children and moved to Williamsburg, Wayne County, Indiana. The two children were:
- William Trotter - born ca. 1808 - Married Elizabeth Garrett, possibly in Indiana. Rachel Trotter - born ca. 1809 - married Henry L. Macy, son of Joseph & Mary (Way) Macy. Rachel Trotter died 1893 in Indiana.
- # 3. Edward Trotter - lived and died in Guilford County, N. C. He was born ca. 1779. His wife was Hannah Midliff whom he married August 20, 1799 in Guilford County, N. C. His death occurred on August 20, 1860 in the same county. Children of this union were:

- # 4. Nancy Trotter - No information.
- # 5. Rachel Trotter - Guilford County, N. C. marriage bonds list a Rachel Trotter to Samuel Rich on June 20, 1801, Moses Cranor, signs. No further information.
- # 6. Oldom Trotter - Did live in Guilford County, N. C. In 1836 I find an Oldom Trotter in Davidson County, N. C. In the letter Oldom Trotter married in Iowa and had one daughter. No proof for any of this.
- # 7. Jane Trotter - No information. Guilford County marriage bonds list a Jane Trotter to Jeremiah Poore on September 19, 1838. She may also have married Moses Craner.

- # 8. Betsey Trotter - Married David Armfield. No date or place found. He was reported to be the 6th son of William Armfield. To this union were born the following children:

He was in Rowan County, N. C. as early as 1800 and as late as 1815, according to several deeds in the Rowan County Court House. To him and his wife the following children were born:

- # 11. George Trotter - lived and died in Guilford County, N. C. His wife was Sarah. It is not known how many children he had. In his will made April 18, 1819 and probated February 1821, he refers to "my four daughters," but does not name them. Son John Trotter was named executor.

John Trotter, son of above George Trotter was born February 15, 1785, in Guilford County, N. C. He married Elizabeth (Betsey) Killian on April 27, 1815, in the same county. She was born ca. 1792 and died November 13, 1862. John Trotter died May 11, 1853 at the age of 68. He left a will which named his wife Elizabeth and sons George W. Trotter, William Trotter and John M. Trotter. One daughter Sarah J. Trotter. Another daughter, Irena Trotter, not named in the will, was at that time married to Andrew Scott and living in Hutchison, Minnesota. CHARLES HARDIN

Charles HARDIN, I

Charles HARDIN's land grant for 640 acres in the County of Guilford was surveyed 3 Oct. 1778 with chain bearers John HARDIN and John BRIGANCE, signed by Joshua SMITH. The land was located on both sides of Brushy Fork and Alamance Creek and joined William DOAK's land.

In Will Book A, page 186, is recorded Charles HARDIN's Will, proved in 1807. He names a wife Jean; sons, Stewart, John, and Charles; Unmarried daughters Rebekah and Catherine; a son-in-law David BRIGANCE; and an indentured servant David PRITCHETT. The original Will is located in the North Carolina Archives, Raleigh.

Charles HARDIN, II

The Charles HARDIN whose will was contested in 1857, and the estate later divided equally among his seven living children and the heirs of his one deceased son John HARDIN, can be proven the son mentioned in the Will of the first Charles HARDIN through the land conveyances of his heirs. Both the first wife, mother of Charles HARDIN's children, and his second wife, (Guilford County Marriage Bond 12 May 1819) Charlotte VICKREY, widow of Peter FIELDS, died before 1853.

The original Will of the second Charles HARDIN, and the documents which have been copied below are located in Charles HARDIN's Estate File in the Archives, Raleigh, North Carolina, Call No. C. R. 46.522.

Be it remembered, that at a Court of Common Pleas and Quarter Sessions, begun and held for the county of Guilford, at the Court House in Greensborough, on the third Monday (16th day) of February, A.D. 1857, - the following Justices of the Peace in & for said county present on the bench and holding said court, to wit: - Peter ADAMS, Eli SMITH, Archibald WILSON and Anselm REED, Esquires.

A paper writing, purporting to be the last will and Testament of Charles HARDIN, deceased, and which is in words and figures following, to wit: - "I Charles HARDIN of the county of Guilford and the state of North Carolina, being of sound mind, and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say. -

"First, That my Executors (herein after named) shall provide for my body a decent Burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends, and pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts, howsoever and to whomsoever owing, out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part and parcel of my estate.

CHARLES HARDIN (Continued)

"Item 1st I give and devise to my son David ten dollars to my daughter Jinny SWAIM the like sum of ten dollars, to my daughter Ibby TROGDON ten dollars the above named sums to be paid out of my effects by my Executor herewith named.

"Item 2nd I will and devise the balance of my estate to be equilly divided between Polly HUNTER, Betsey HARDIN, Cynthia FIELD and Peggy CAUSEY and lastly I do hereby appoint my trusty friends Samuel HUNTER and Roddy FIELDS my lawful Executors to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last Will and Testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same and evry part and parcel of the same, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and Testaments heretofore made.

"In witness whereof I the said Charles HARDIN do hereunto set my hand and seal this 19th day of April, A. D. 1853.

"Signed sealed published and declared by the said Charles HARDIN to be his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.

Whereupon, David HARDIN, Marmaduke SWAIM & wife Jinny SWAIM, two of the heirs at law and next of kin of the said Charles HARDIN, came into Court and enter a caveat to the probate thereof, and say that the same is not the last will and Testament of the said Charles HARDIN, or any part thereof.

And therefore, the Court directs the following issue to be made up and submitted to a Jury, to wit:

And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that John TROGDON & Ibby TROGDON, the other heirs at law and next of kin of the said Charles HARDIN reside beyond the limits of this State: It is ordered that publication be made in the Greensboro Patriot and Flag, for six weeks notifying them to appear at the next term of this Court, then and there to see proceedings in the case and to make themselves parties to the issue, if they shall think proper so to do.

BEVILL, Joshua STARR, Jacob CROWDER, Jonathan COBLE, John MOON, Philip ISLEY, Daniel WIRICK, F. S. CARPENTER and George W. PHIPPS, - who for their verdict say they find the paper writing and every part thereof to be the Last Will and Testament of Charles HARDIN, deceased, which is in the following words and figures, to wit;

(Here the will is copied again in its entirety enclosed within quotes just as before.)

Therefore, the Court doth decide and adjudge, that the said will and every part thereof was duly executed to pass the real and personal estate of the testator, Charles HARDIN, and that the same be recorded and filed.

From which judgment the Defendants pray and obtain an Appeal to the superior Court, and give as security John McCULLOCK, S. V. BARKER and Joseph NEWMAN.

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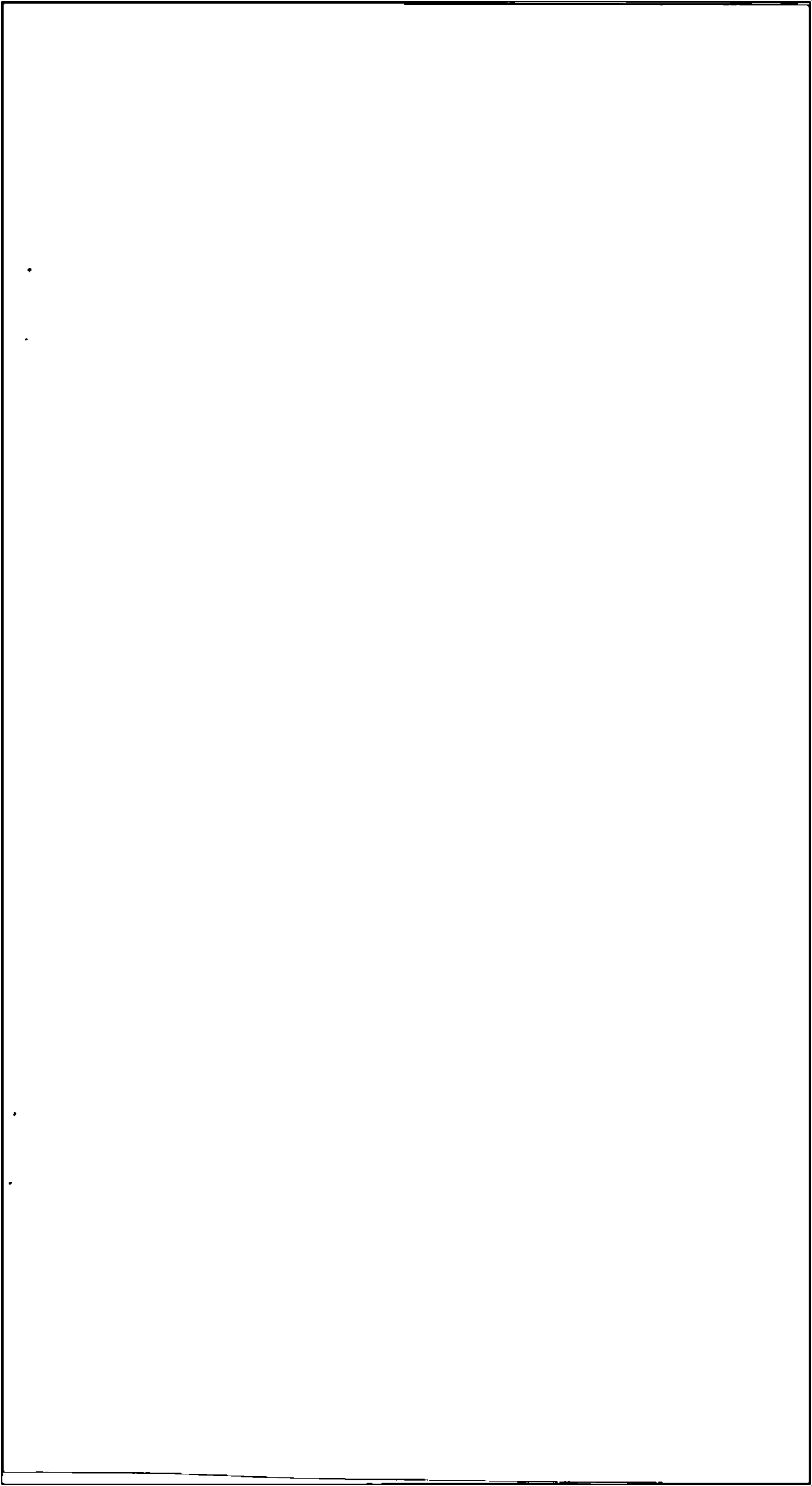
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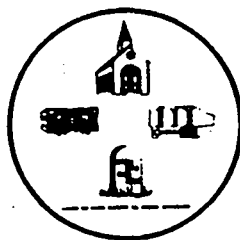
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The fiscal year for the society begins annually at the ~~September~~ meeting.

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THE FLORAL ALBUM OF MRS. EUGENIA HOOKER ALBEA

Genealogists often refer to court records and family Bibles and sometimes overlook other sources less obvious for their genealogical value. One unusual source in the collection of the High Point Museum is an autograph album with family records from 1847 to 1873. The volume was donated by Mrs. John Eschelman of High Point, N. C., and is entitled Scriptural Album With Floral Illustrations, J. C. Riker, New York (no date). Written on the frontispiece of the album is the inscription "O.A.E. Eugenia Hooker, Presented by her brother H.O.W. Hooker, Sept. 4, 1847". Alas, the names behind the initials of H.O.W. Hooker are not revealed in the book, however one playmate of Eugenia Hooker was thoughtful enough to inscribe her friend's complete name, i.e., Olivia Almira Elizabeth Eugenia Hooker. Genealogical information has been gleaned from notations in the album, such as one poem written "to Olivia...by your affectionate sister, Julia A. Frances Hooker", and from several newspaper obituaries glued into the volume.

The following Hooker-Albea-Wright lineage was pieced together from the Floral Album:

- I. Mr. Cranberry Albea, was born 22 August 1787 in Montgomery County, Maryland and died September 5, 1868, age 81 years, at Olin, Iredell County, North Carolina. His wife is unknown.

Issue:

1. Rev. William W. Albea of Winston-Salem, N. C.
 2. Cetha M. Albea, b. 14 Dec. 1808, d. Sept. 3, 1856 in Yadkin County, N. C., age 48 years. (perhaps others)
- II. Rev. William W. Albea, a Methodist minister of Winston-Walem, North Carolina, married prior to 1852 Miss Olivia Almira Elizabeth Eugenia Hooker. She was the daughter of Nathan Hooker of Hillsboro, N. C., and Julia A. (Wright) Hooker, b. 24 Dec. 1804, Pitt Co., N. C. died 22 October ca. 1869. Hillsboro, Orange Co., N. C. Julia A. (Wright) Hooker was the daughter of Joseph and Anna Wright. Nathan Hooker and his wife Julia A. (Wright) Hooker has six children, four of whom were:
 1. Olivia Almira Elizabeth Eugenia Hooker. (married Rev. William W. Albea).
 2. Mr. H. O. W. Hooker.
 3. Miss Cornelia Hooker, d. July 8, 1852, Hillsboro, N. C.
 4. Miss Julia A. Frances Hooker.

Rev. William W. Albea and O.A.E. Eugenia (Hooker) Albea had two children, one son, and one daughter named Miss Julia Albea.

- III. Miss Julia Albea was born Sept. 17, 1860, never married, studied music at Greensboro Female College. She was a Methodist and was admitted in January 1942 to the Greensboro Masonic Home. She died Jan. 13, 1956, age 96 years, and was buried in Winston-Salem, N. C.

In addition to the genealogical material in the Floral Album, Mrs. Albea preserved in its pages her favorite poems printed in newspapers, poems of friends at the Greensboro Female College (1847-1848), and notations of her travels such as her trip to "Laura Town Mountains, Stokes Co, N. C., July 1854." Among the numerous recipes written in the Floral Album is one for "Blackberry":

"To one quart of the strained juice of the ripe berry, add two quarts of water, then add three pounds of loaf or best clarified sugar to every gallon of the liquid. Set it by to ferment, skim it everyday for three weeks; then strain it through a flannel bag and put it in a jug. At Christmas you may drain it off and bottle it up."

When I consider the short duration of my life, swallowed up in the eternity that went before me and the eternity that come after, the small extent of space I fill, the narrow limits of my field of view, swallowed up as I am in the infinite immensities of space, which I do not know, and which know not me, I am terrified and astonished to find myself here rather than there, why now rather than then. That for the full accomplishment of their said intention, this 12th day of the fifth month, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, they, the said Robert HODSON and Catherine NEWBY, appeared at a public meeting of Friends, at Springfield meeting-house in the County of Guilford, and they the said Robert HODSON and Catherine NEWBY did, in a public manner, openly declare they they took each other for husband and wife; and as a further confirmation thereof, they, the said Robert HODSON and Catherine NEWBY did to these presents set their hands, she, according to the custom of Marriage, assuming the name of her husband.

BLACK JACK SCHOOL REGISTER FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER 1887

Black Jack (ca. 1845-1924), a one-room log school house and one among several similar schools in the area, was a forerunner to the Sumner Consolidated School, founded in 1924 in Sumner Township.

The 1887-1888 school term, taught by Albert Lyndon Vickrey, was for four months (November-February) according to his Diary, but his roll and attendance records for November are missing.

The "register" was a piece of folded and lined writing paper. Students' names were listed on the left side with hand-drawn vertical lines on the right to block off the days of the month. Days present were marked by a "/" in the blocks. The size of the paper would accommodate only one month's attendance; therefore, the "register" had to be completely redone each month. Fire builders were listed on the back page. Average daily attendance: December - 20; January - 37; February - 36. RFT

7-A The Perez CHIPMAN, Jr., FAMILY CEMETERY. From Hwy 68 at Deep River Friends Meeting House, drive westward 2 miles on Skeet Club Road (#1820), turn north 0.9mi. on Kendale Road (#1834), parking opposite the driveway of "The Jim Halls", Rte. 1, Box 153A. Walk eastward along the fenced tree-line to a cluster of Sassafras trees, beneath which are a group of English boxwoods guarding a periwinkle-carpeted cemetery, densely overgrown with thorny vines. Five native head-stones are found, none with any carved identification. ((This cemetery was called to our attention by a descendant, Mrs. Willma Humphreys Newton (P.O.Box 41, Hampton, Ark. 71744), thought to be the burying ground of Perez Chipman, Jr. (1729-1801), his wife, Margaret Malone (1728-1803), and their son Paris Chipman (d.1803). Perez Chipman served in the Revolutionary War and thereafter moved to Guilford County.))

9-A The William HENDERSON FAMILY CEMETERY. In High Point, behind the home of Mrs. Ida Guyer Lambert (a descendant) at 1910 North Centennial, is a fenced cemetery about 25 yards square, neatly cleared of underbrush, with a halfdozen unidentified graves (primitive stones or sunken sites), and the following legible stones, one broken and another fallen from its pedestal.

MARY BUNDY AND HUSBAND JOHN ALBERTSON

Mary Bundy, b. 12-1-1763
d. 12-7-1834

Mary Bundy and husband John Albertson came to Washington County, Indiana, from North Carolina in 1816. . . . These people encountered new problems in addition to the hardships of the frontier and the shortage of money. Racial prejudice was one such problem. As many Quaker Bundys sought a newer, freer life on the frontier, they sought to extend this freedom to slaves and free Blacks; thus adding to their problems. I have no record that our Bundys carried Blacks with them into Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois, but I feel sure that some did. Samuel Weeks writes that both Indiana and Illinois residents were alarmed at the numbers of Blacks that were pouring into the region by way of North Carolina Quakers. A place south of Chambersburg, Indiana was called "Little Africa." Laws were passed in Illinois in 1831 and in Indiana in 1832 forbidding the transporting of slaves there for the purpose of freeing them and prohibiting free Blacks from migrating there. New York and Pennsylvania passed Negro exclusion laws. Many, including some Northerners of influence, favored containment of the Negro in the South, Our Bundy Quaker ancestors sought human dignity (and were sometimes incarcerated for their efforts) wherever they settled and the hostility they met added to their burdens in the already unfriendly environment of the West.

Similar racial problems resulted from Quaker concerns for the Indians. Evidences of friendly Quaker and Indian relations are reinforced by the following court case in the State of Kansas in 1884 when Mary A. Henley went to court to claim her Indian citizenship.

Henley of Douglas County and State of Kansas to me well known and who I certify to be credible and respectable who being by me first duly Affirmed deposed and said that she is a person of Cherokee Indian descent and was born in Randolph County and State of North Carolina.
That her age is 66 years and her Post Office Address is Hesper, Douglas County State of Kansas
that she is a Daughter of one Martha Allen a Person of Indian descent who was Born in Randolph County and State of North Carolina in the year A. D. 1866

that the said Martha Allen was the Daughter of one Mary Clark a Person of Cherokee Indian descent who it is said was Born in Gilford (sic) County and State of North Carolina in the year 1771 and Died in Gilford County . . . in the Year A. D., 1842 that the said (Mary Clark) was the Daughter of one Mary Sanders whose Maiden name was Mary Elmore a Cherokee Indian woman who it is said was Born in the Cherokee Nation East of the Mississippi River in the year A. D. 1752 and Died in Gilford County . . . in the year A. D. 1826.

Declared further says that she and her Children Viz., Daniel W. Henley age 38 years, John C. Henley age 35 years, Jesse C. Henley age 33 years, Hezekiah A. Henley age 27 years, Guliaelma M. Henley age 24 years and Samuel T. Henley age 22 years are Persons of Cherokee Indian descent entitled to all the rights priviledges and immunities in the Cherokee Nation of any Citizen thereof. She therefore submits her Claim to the Honorable Secretary of Interior and Prays that the Honorable Secretary will cause such action to be taken as will secure her and her Children as aforesaid equal rights priviledges and immunities in the Cherokee Nation...and for such other and farther relief as the Honorable Secretary of Interior may deem proper and just in the premises.

. . . John and Mary Albertson and their children, and the subject of our sketch was a Miss of twelve years . . . came to Washington Co. the summer of 1816, driving in their wagon, several other families coming at the same time. . . The Albertson family settled in Salem... They were very strict Quakers and from this home the family went regularly to old Blue River to attend meetings. . . About the same time another Quaker family, Abraham and (Mournen) Bundy and their children came to Washington Co. to make a new home . . . It fell to the lot of the son Abram of this family, who was a lad sixteen years old when they came to Indiana, to help clear the forest and build the log cabin to be their home. . . In the summer of 1822, Abram Bundy and Phereby Albertson were married according to the rites of the Friends.

GUILFORD COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

THE BY-LAWS

(Revised April 28, 1976)

ARTICLE I - OBJECTIVES

1. To increase interest in and raise the standards of genealogical research and compilation by means of educational programs, workshops, and the publication of genealogical data.
2. To encourage and instruct members in the art and practice of genealogical research and compilation.
3. To acquaint members of sources of genealogical material.
4. To serve as a medium of exchange of genealogical information.
5. To promote the collection, preservation, and utilization of manuscripts, documents, and other materials of genealogical value.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

1. There shall be four classes of membership: active (including life), sustaining, honorary, and society and institutional.
2. Active membership is open to all who are interested in genealogy, either as amateurs or professionals, and in the society's objectives. Only active and sustaining members may hold office and vote.
3. Honorary membership may be conferred upon any person whom the board of directors deems worthy of exceptional recognition. Honorary members shall be granted all rights and privileges of membership except the right to vote, hold office, and serve as committee chairmen.
4. Societies and institutions may be eligible for nonvoting membership in payment of dues.
5. All persons joining the society during the first fiscal year shall have their names inscribed in the minutes as charter members.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

1. The officers of the society shall be residents of Guilford County and shall include, but need not be limited to, the following: President, First vice president, Second vice president, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Librarian, and Editor.
2. The term of office of all elected officers shall be one year. The President and vice presidents shall be ineligible to serve more than three consecutive years.

3. Officers shall be elected and installed at the September meeting by a plurality vote of qualified members present.
4. Article IV provides for the elevation of vice presidents in the event of vacancies during their terms of office. Other vacancies shall be filled by the officers.
5. The board of directors shall consist of the elected officers of the society.
6. During the interim between meetings of the society, the officers shall have all necessary power and authority, not inconsistent with the charter and by-laws, over the affairs of the society.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. The president shall preside at all meetings of the society and of the board of directors; shall call special meetings of the society and board of directors if necessary; shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the nominating committee; and shall appoint all committee chairmen not otherwise provided for and said chairman shall have authority to select or remove members of his or her committee.
2. The first vice president shall preside in the absence of the president; shall succeed to the presidency in case of a vacancy; and shall serve as chairman of the program and publicity committee unless otherwise provided for.
3. The second vice president shall preside in the absence of both the president and first vice president; shall succeed to the first vice presidency in case of a vacancy; and shall serve as chairman of the records committee.
4. The treasurer shall receive and be responsible for all dues and other funds received by the society and shall keep accurate records thereof; shall deposit funds in a bank or other financial institution approved by the board of directors; shall pay bills and make purchases in accordance with procedures approved by the officers; shall submit reports to the membership at each meeting, the fourth (fall) report to serve as the annual report to the membership; shall notify members who are in arrears in dues; and shall assist the recording and corresponding secretaries in keeping a roster of active members.
5. The recording secretary shall keep a minute book of proceedings of the society, have custody of important society documents and maintain, with the assistance of the treasurer, an up-to-date roster of members of the society.
6. The corresponding secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the society and maintain file copies; give notice of all meetings, collaborate with the publications and records committee in the maintenance and preservation of the records and publications of the society.

7. The librarian shall be responsible for collecting and controlling genealogical materials that will be of value to the society; shall be the official bibliographer; and shall receive all donations of printed materials.
8. The editor, with staff, shall be responsible for collecting, editing, publishing, and distributing THE GUILFORD COUNTY GENEALOGIST.
9. Each officer and committee chairman shall formally deliver to his or her successor within thirty days after election, all records and property of the society in his or her custody.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS AND QUORUMS

1. The society shall meet the 4th Wednesday - September, February and April. The November meeting shall be the 3rd Wednesday. All meetings shall be held at 7:30 p.m. at a place to be selected by the Executive Committee. The September meeting shall be the annual meeting.
2. The officers shall meet within thirty days after each regular meeting and at other times at the call of the president or a vice president.
3. At meetings of the society, twelve active members present shall constitute a quorum. At meetings of the board of directors, a simple majority of the incumbent members of the board shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI - DUES

1. The fiscal year for the society shall begin annually at the September meeting.
2. The dues for life members shall be ~~\$100.00~~. The annual dues for sustaining members shall be ~~\$25.00~~, and for society and institutional members ~~\$10.00~~, and for individual members ~~\$7.50~~ and ~~\$2.50~~ per each additional member up to a maximum of ~~\$10.00~~ per family, payable on or before January 1. Members failing to pay dues within 30 days of due date shall be declared not in good standing and those failing to pay dues for one year shall be dropped from the roster of members.
3. Any member joining the society after the April meeting need not pay dues for the current fiscal year.

ARTICLE VII - COMMITTEES

1. The nominating committee shall consist of a chairman and two members appointed by the president at least three months prior to the annual meeting. At the annual meeting the nominating committee shall submit, with his or her consent, the name of at least one nominee for each elective office. Additional nominations may be made from the floor.

2. The program and publicity committee shall consist of the first vice president as chairman and three other members appointed by the president. The committee shall be responsible for programs and all arrangements therefore at scheduled meetings. The committee shall also be responsible for publicity, including coverage in the various news media.

3. The records committee shall consist of the second vice president as chairman and three additional members appointed by the president. The committee shall make recommendations to the board of directors concerning materials to be published by the society and the president shall be responsible for the implementation of decisions of the board in connections therewith (See Article IX). The committee shall cooperate with the secretaries in matters relating to the maintenance of the society's correspondence and other records.

4. The auditing committee shall consist of three members appointed by the president. Within thirty days prior to the annual meeting the committee shall conduct an audit of the fiscal records of the treasurer and shall submit a report thereof to the members at the annual meeting.

5. Ad hoc and other special committees which from time to time the membership or board of directors may consider necessary may be appointed by the president.

ARTICLE VIII - PUBLICATIONS

1. A genealogical newsletter may be published by the society at the discretion of the board of directors.
2. The editor, with staff, shall be responsible for the publication of THE GUILFORD COUNTY GENEALOGIST.
3. At the discretion of the board of directors, other documentary material may be published by the society.
4. Expenditures made in connection with the publication program shall be made in accordance with the annual budget and procedures approved by the board of directors.

ARTICLE IX - ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Robert's Rules of Order (latest edition) shall be the parliamentary authority to be followed in meetings of the society.
2. The order of business at meetings of the society shall be as follows:
 - a. Reading and approval of minutes of the previous meeting,
 - b. Communications,

- c. Reports of officers and committee chairmen,
- d. Old business,
- e. New business,
- f. Election and installation of officers (at the September meeting),
- g. Adjournment.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

The charter and by-laws may be amended by a majority of the qualified members present and voting at an annual meeting provided that all changes had been presented at a prior meeting of the society and charged to the by-laws committee for study and recommendation at the annual meeting.
